Thank you for your interest in working to protect the water quality of our local streams! The purpose of the rain garden cost-share assistance grant is to financially assist property owners within the City of Westerville with the placement of rain gardens on their property. **Eligibility for this grant requires that the property be located within the City of Westerville.**

A rain garden is an attractive landscaped area in a low spot on a property designed to catch storm water runoff from impervious surfaces (i.e., rooftops, driveways, sidewalks). Rain gardens are planted with native perennials that allow the runoff to infiltrate naturally into the ground, prevent pollutants from entering our streams, slow the flow of water from a yard during and after a storm, and recharge groundwater. As part of the application process, you are asked to work with Franklin Soil and Water Conservation District to help with sizing and location.

The City of Westerville will offer grants, in an amount not to exceed \$250.00, as reimbursement for the purchase of plants, mulch, or compost for a rain garden on your property. Applications will be accepted throughout 2014, however only six (6) grants will be awarded on a first-come, first-served basis, for **approved** applications.

Reimbursement for plants, mulch, or compost used in your rain garden will be provided after an on-site visit from a Franklin Soil & Water representative to verify that your rain garden has been completed. All plants must be planted and the original receipts from your plant, mulch, or compost purchases must be submitted in order to receive reimbursement. Once the rain garden is properly documented, you should receive your reimbursement for the amount of the actual documented costs or \$250.00, whichever is less, within 30 days. No reimbursement will be provided for items purchased but not planted in the rain garden area.

Initials **Agreement:**

- _____ 1. **The maximum amount of cost-share available is \$250.00 to go toward materials for rain garden installation (plants, mulch, and/or compost).**
- _____ 2. **Checks will be made out to the buyer of the materials with receipt documentation showing the purchase of the materials no sooner than 3 days before the approval of the application, and no later than 15 days after the planting of the rain garden.**
- _____ 3. **Cost-share will not be awarded to a rain garden completed prior to the application date.**
- _____ 4. **Grant winners will be notified by phone once awarded to coordinate the purchase and delivery of materials. Franklin Soil and Water and the City of Westerville are not responsible for any labor involved in any project, nor are they liable for any damages or injuries incurred through the project.**
- _____ 5. **The landowner agrees to maintain their rain garden for at least 3 years, unless the property is sold.**
- _____ 6. **The landowner agrees to go over careful instructions on rain garden design and installations with Franklin Soil and Water, either through a technical workshop, site visit, or consultation (free to applicants). Date of workshop/site visit/consult _____**
- _____ 7. **Notification of excavation and planting must be made to Franklin Soil and Water, and notification of completion of planting must be made to Franklin Soil and Water no later than 1 week before or after installation or completion.**
- _____ 8. **The cost-share grant requires that you allow Franklin Soil and Water and Westerville representatives to photograph and document your rain garden before, during, and after planting. Pictures from your garden may be used in publications, reports, and educational programs. Throughout the duration of your rain garden (to be maintained at minimum 3 years), additional photographs may be taken. You will receive prior notification when anyone will be on your property to document your rain garden.**

We will not share your rain garden location/address unless permission is granted by the landowner. Do you grant us permission to share the location address for educational purposes only? (If yes, you may contact us in the future to decline permission.)
